RE: Doncaster Right of Way

She:kon:

Concerning your letter of May 19/87, the Mohawk Councils of Kanesatake and Kahnawake are hereby confirming and accepting the agreement as stated in the letter.

Specifically, both Councils agree that:

"Hydro-Québec will build two new lines outside of the Doncaster Reserve before the end of 1987 and will not require any right of way for these new lines.

Hydro-Québec will then remove both lines actually located on the Doncaster Reserve except for one section of the single phase line required to supply power to the caretaker house on the Doncaster Reserve, that will have approximately seven (7) poles from this house toward Ste-Julie des Laurentides. As this section of line will be used to supply electricity to Mohawks' houses and camps only, no rent is paid for the right of way required and the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake should accept the actual location of the poles and the new anchors that may be required at the dead end pole of this section of line. All these works shall be completed before the end of 1987.


Hydro-Québec has paid and the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake has received \$550. per year for the annual payment for the right of way for the following years: 1982/83, 1983/84, 1984/85 and 1985/86. Hydro-Québec will verify if the payment of \$550. has been done for 1986/87 and if the check has been cashed; if not, a check to the amount of \$550. will be mailed to you without delay.

Hydro-Québec has agreed to pay to the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake the sum of \$5,275. for compensation for an increase in the number of poles and the acreage of the right of way between 1972 and 1982 and the increase of rent for the right of way between 1982 and 1987. The payment should be made to the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake no later than 45 days after receipt of the acceptance of this agreement by your council."

For the record, however, it should be clarified that the Mohawk Council of Kahnawake was represented by Mr. John Morris and Mr. Tom Morris at the meeting of May 12/87.

Trusting the above acknowledgement is satisfactory, we remain,
